The France-Stanford Center for Interdisciplinary Studies invites proposals for scholarly conferences or workshops to be held during academic year 2024-25 (September 1, 2024 through August 31, 2025).

#### **Overview**

The conferences or workshops may be held at Stanford or at any French educational or research institution. We are especially interested in conferences offering the opportunity to explore differences of disciplinary or interdisciplinary approach between the two countries, and in those involving participants from other francophone countries outside of France.

#### **Proposal**

Proposals should be for conferences or workshops that bring together participants from Stanford and France (and may also include participants from elsewhere). They may include anywhere between 5 and 30 participants. Please be sure to follow the instructions for submission detailed [here](#).

#### **Budget**

The amount of funding provided depends on the size and scope of the conference or workshop proposed. Please note that proposals that contemplate cost sharing with other funding sources may have an advantage over those whose only source is funding from the France-Stanford Center.

#### **Application procedure**

Proposals should describe the proposed event specifying its general interest and suitability to the goals of the France-Stanford Center and identifying potential participants. They should include a budget and propose a tentative date. Informal inquiries made prior to writing a formal proposal would be welcome.

Applications must be submitted jointly by researchers affiliated with any Stanford department and a French educational or research institution who are eligible to serve as principal investigators.

Please note that there is no citizenship requirement for this program: applicants need not possess either French or U.S. citizenship.

**Stanford PIs are responsible for contacting their departmental administrative support before submitting their application to confirm that administrative support can be provided for the conference organization, should the proposal be selected.**
